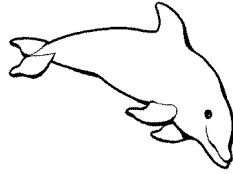

### What do government labels and approvals mean for you?

**Background:** As you shop around for an ionic foot bath, vendors will tell you that their unit has been tested for this or that agency approval, and that this is a reason you should buy their unit. Does using labels like “FCC approved” and “Class IIA medical approval” lead you to believe that there is something more that you are getting for your money? These approvals are often required just to sell a unit in a particular jurisdiction. But what value do they add for you, the professional or end user?

**The Truth:** Labels may sound impressive but when you dig down you find that they have little to do with whether a unit is safer or more effective than another. Know that these labels are device classifications, having no bearing on the degree to which the device may be benefiting the person having a session.
